The competition started for the BBC in a national competition where pupils which have to write no more than 500 words.

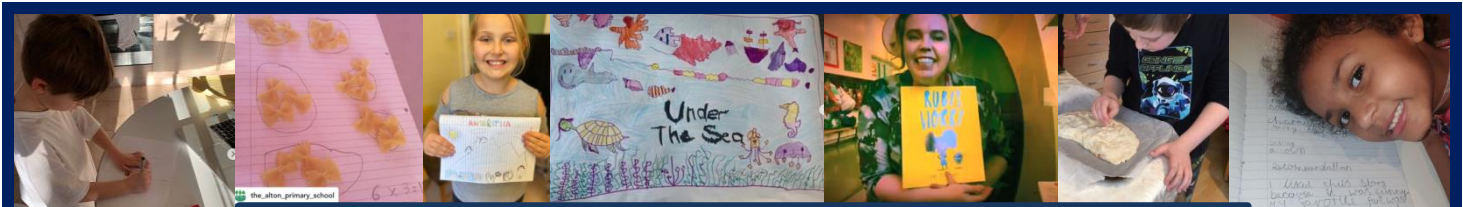
This year, our Q1E Choice competition by writing an online story they for a winner, which was read by every child in the trust. A final winner was chosen by one of the class winners.

We share

- First three weeks focused on revision and consolidation of prior learning
- Progressive learning from week four, following planned curriculum
- Maths and English every day for every year group
- Daily activities covering subjects across the broader curriculum
- Subject specific guidance and additional work for particular groups
- Storytime, Artspace, VE Day museum, virtual sports day, holiday learning...

We talk

- *Every child every week* – phone calls from staff to pupils and families
- Additional calls to the most vulnerable children
- *Teachers talk the plan* - demonstrating approaches, explaining activities
- Teacher and headteacher video messages on the website
- Zoom teaching for specific groups
- *Talking together* – zoom class meetings

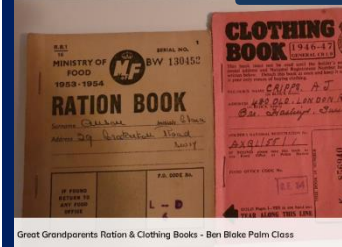
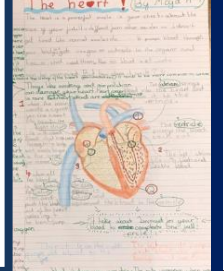
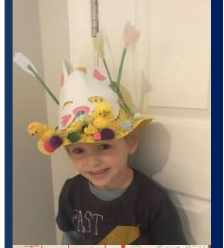
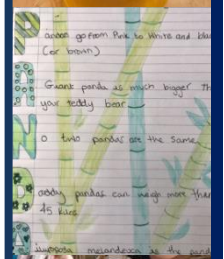
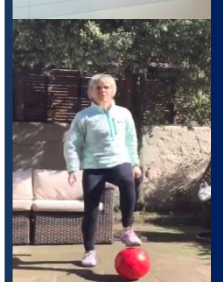
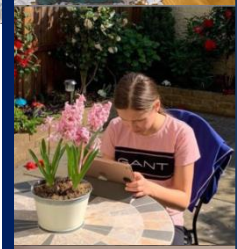
You share

- Parent surveys about home learning and access to technology
- SeeSaw used for children to share their learning with their teachers
- New twitter and Instagram accounts for parents to share proud moments
- Designated email contacts for each school, for parents to ask questions

Key actions to support children, families and staff

- New home learning website developed before lockdown: relevant work for pupils in all year groups from **day one** of closure.
- **Home learning shared with and accessed by many beyond the trust.**
- On-site provision for vulnerable and key worker children from **day one**, combined onto two Q1E sites, including Easter and bank holidays.
- **Almost all staff able to work from home until wider opening in June; shielding/vulnerable staff remained on home learning teams throughout.**
- Learning resources purchased and delivered for children needing them most, including ICT equipment, books, art materials and WiFi provision.
- **Over £7000 of supermarket vouchers purchased for families entitled to free school meals, before the government voucher schemes were launched.**
- Additional safeguarding policy agreed, plus guidance on supporting children and staff with bereavement.
- **Weekly trust board meetings held from mid-March to the end of the summer term, in addition to scheduled local governing body meetings.**
- Full risk assessment process before wider opening.

66% of nursery, reception, year 1 and year 6 children across the trust returned to school in June (compared with 30% nationally)
